Is Faith Relevant to My Life?

Human Need: Certainty

All of us need to know that some things are certain in our lives. For example, we need to know that we have enough money to provide a decent place to live, clothing, food, transportation, and health care. We need to know we can count on our family and close friends for help and companionship. When we become uncertain about these things or our future, our stress levels go way up. Therefore, we sometimes experience anxiety about passing certain tests or interviews. Our future is at stake.

Jesus made some bold promises to his followers, to those who trust and believe in him.

So, don't worry. Don't say, 'What will we eat?' Or, 'What will we drink?' Or, 'What will we wear?' People who are ungodly run after all those things. Your Father, who is in heaven, knows that you need them. But put God's kingdom first. Do what he wants you to do. Then all those things will also be given to you. So, don't worry about tomorrow. Tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own (Matthew 6:31-34).

It is said there are only two things certain in life. One is taxes and the other is death. We are forced each paycheck and year to think about taxes, but most of us put the thought of death far from our mind. And yet, it is certain all of us will one day die.

**The Bible teaches that having faith in Jesus Christ gives us peace of mind in this life and prepares us for life after death.**

There once was a man, named Nicodemus, who came to Jesus to ask him some questions. Nicodemus was a very good person with a respected reputation in his community. And yet, Jesus told Nicodemus that if he wanted to enter God's kingdom/family, he needed to be born again. Born again has the idea of a new beginning with a relationship with God. These thoughts are summarized by one of the most famous sentences in the Bible, found in John, chapter 3, verse 16.

God loved the world so much, that he gave his one and only Son. Anyone who believes in him will not perish (come to ruin) but will have eternal life (life with God forever).

You might wonder how faith in Jesus brings eternal life? The answer has to do with a legal transaction

motivated by amazing love. Let's say you owe money to a credit card company along with some late fees. Then your very good friend assumed responsibility for your debts and paid the credit card company all that you owed. You would be forgiven of the debt, penalties, and hence, free from worry. This is a picture of what Jesus did for humanity. We broke God's law to love him first and to love others. We deserve the shame and punishment that comes from broken relationships with God and others. So, Jesus assumed responsibility for us and took our shame and punishment when he died on the cross. He could do this because he had no sin of his own. We receive forgiveness when we accept his payment, given on the cross, on our behalf.

There are many Scriptures that tell the story of Jesus' sinless life and of his suffering on the cross. There are other Scriptures that describe the purpose or meaning of his death. Here is one of them.

But the servant (Jesus) was pierced because we had sinned.  
He was crushed because we had done what was evil.  
He was punished to make us whole again.  
His wounds have healed us.  
All of us are like sheep. We have wandered away from God.  
All of us have turned to our own way.  
And the Lord has placed on his servant  
the sins of all of us. Isaiah 53:5,6
